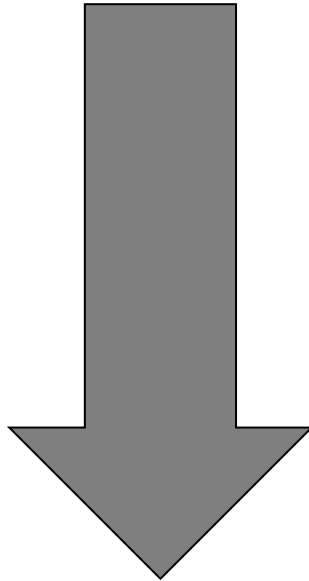

1983: Development of the Domain Name System

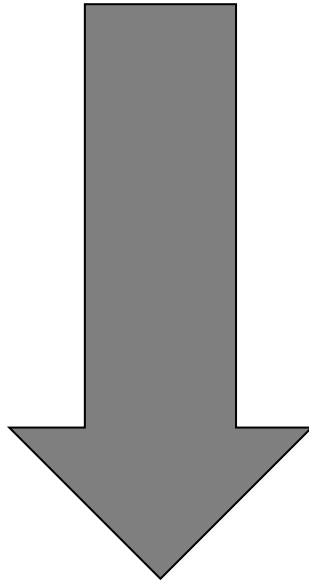
To replace the 'host.txt file' of network node names and their associated IP addresses



Administration/DNS of the few domains mostly by universities or individuals on a voluntary basis



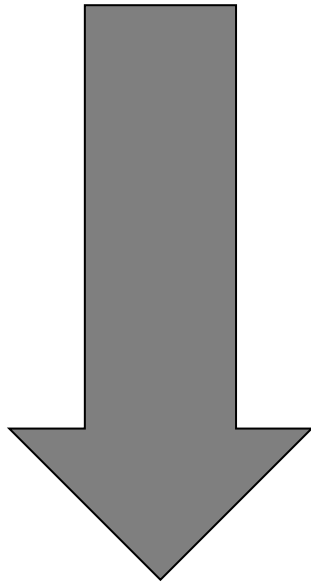
Early 1990'ies: Rapid growth of the number of domain names

DNS.be launches DNSSEC in the .be zone

On the 17th of August in Leuven, Belgium, DNS BE launched the DNSSEC protocol. From the press release: "DNS BE has always put a high priority and focus on the safety aspects of management of DNS for .be. From now on, and just a few weeks after the rollout of DNSSEC from ICANN, the infrastructure name servers DNS BE supports the DNSSEC protocol."

DNSSEC protects more than one seventh of the Czech Internet

The Czech Republic is maintaining its leading position in the number of domains secured by DNSSEC technology. To this day, 100 024 of .CZ domains have been protected from misuse and forgery (the 100,000th DNSSEC-secured .CZ domain was registered on July 29). In August .CZ hit 700,000 domains.

Distribution of .eu registrations among registrars
EURid has taken a closer look at the distribution of .eu registrations among its registrars and has found that 65 % of domain name registrants chose a registrar from their own country, 18 % chose a registrar from a different country in the European Union, and 17% chose a registrar located outside the EU.

FICORA will introduce the Domain Name System Security Extension (DNSSEC) for Finnish domain names in two phases. The first phase, signing the .fi root, began on 18 August.

The number of .IS Domains has now reached 30,000. The ccTLD .IS is one of the "smallest" Top Level Domains in the whole DNS Society, but also one of the most secure ones according to McAfee report.

The IE Domain Registry (IEDR) today reported the best performing second quarter for .ie domain registrations in Ireland since records began.

In Arnhem (23 August), SIDN successfully signed the .nl zone with DNSSEC. Signing the zone is the first step towards a large-scale roll-out of DNSSEC.
